Special Education Priorities

- 2. Through professional development and direct, strategic, and ongoing support, educators will increase their skills in writing and implementing high-quality instructionally appropriate IEPs that address the academic achievement and functional performance of students with an IEP.
- 3. Through meaningful collaboration, there will be an increase in opportunities for parent(s)/legal guardian(s)and other stakeholders to participate in the development, review, and revision of the individualized education program (IEP) and participate in the education of their children at school and home.
- 4. Through innovative strategies and partnerships with Human Capital, we will recruit and retain highquality special services staff.

Special Education Routines of Practice

All Educators will provide:

- high expectations for students with disabilities;
- appropriate differentiation and scaffolding to support students with disabilities in participation and progress towards the general education curriculum;
- appropriate supplementary supports and services in the general education classroom whenever appropriate as deemed necessary by the IEP team;
- effective systems of behavior support at the school, class, and individual level;
- appropriate skills and knowledge for those who work with students with disabilities to help such students meet academic and functional goals;
- preparation for students to transition to adult living and learning to lead productive, independent adult lives to the maximum extent practicable; and
- high-quality resources and instructional support focused on teaching and learning.
