A unique, work-based learning opportunity where students attend a modified school day through an online learning lab while embedded with an industry partner for hands-on, first-person workforce experience. Students participate in the LOOP program on-site with our various industry partners.



For LOOP students, their day is divided into 2 shifts: an academic shift and a work-based learning shift. One shift is academic and the other shift is a work-based learning opportunity at their industry placement. An example of the shift times might be 7 am - 11 am, then 11 am - 3:30 pm (with a 30 min. lunch). Students do not observe the school calendar for scheduled days off since they are working within the industry partner's schedule. During their placement, students will spend time attending safety training sessions, becoming acquainted with the work process of the industry, meeting with key industry employees, and more.

In conjunction with West Tennessee Healthcare, JMCSS is able to offer placements in Dietary Services or Environmental Services. Students are able to gain valuable experience working within the local healthcare system. Students will select which department they wish to interview with, determining their job duties.









JMCSS and JEA share a vision for providing students options and opportunities for career preparation during high school. JEA will provide students with an overview of the organization in various departments with opportunities to learn job-embedded marketable skills that will help students pursue trade-based career pathways, hopefully with JEA. Selected JEA LOOP students will follow a 2/3 schedule in which students work 3 days per week and complete academic work 2 days per week.
