#### CIRCUMSTANCES

- Students in foster care (including those awaiting foster care placement) shall be immediately enrolled even if the student is unable to produce records normally required for enrollment (e.g. academic records, immunization records, health records, proof of residency) or missed the district's application or enrollment deadlines. JMCSS Board Policy 6.505; TCA 49-6-3102(c).
- Students who are considered homeless pursuant to the McKinney Vento Act shall be immediately enrolled even if the student is unable to produce records normally required for enrollment (e.g. academic records, immunization records, health records, proof of residency) or missed the district's application or enrollment deadlines. JMCSS Board Policy 6.503; 42 USCA §§ 11431 to 11435; TCA 49-5-5001(c)(3).
- Students who are considered migratory shall be immediately enrolled even if the student is unable to produce records normally required for enrollment (e.g. academic records, immunization records, health records, proof of residency) or missed the district's application or enrollment deadlines. JMCSS Board Policy 6.504; Plyler v. Doe, 457 U.S. 202 (1982).
- Dependent children of a military service member that do not reside within the boundaries of the school district are permitted to enroll if: (1) the student is the dependent child of a service member who is being relocated to Tennessee on military orders, and (2) the

parent(s)/guardian(s) of the student provide the school district with documentation evidencing that the student will be a resident of the school district on relocation. However, within twenty (20) days of enrollment, the parent(s)/guardian(s) of the student must provide proof of residency within the school district. JMCSS Board Policy 6.506; TCA 49-6-3101.
