## JMCSS ILLNESS GUIDELINES

Symptom/ Illness	Should <u>NOT</u> attend school or work:	May attend school or work when:
Fever	<ul> <li>Temperature at 100°F or above</li> <li>Behavior changes or other signs/symptoms of illness (e.g., sore throat, rash, vomiting, diarrhea)</li> </ul>	Temperature below 100°F     without the use of a medicine     that reduces fever (such as     Advil or Tylenol) for 24 hours
Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye)	<ul> <li>Eye redness, itching, irritation, swelling in one or botheyes</li> <li>Thick and purulent (pus) discharge</li> <li>Matted eyelashes</li> </ul>	Bacterial Conjunctivitis – after 24 hours of starting antibiotics drops     Viral Conjunctivitis – symptoms improved or dearance from healthcare provider
Cough	<ul> <li>Frequent, uncontrollable, disruptive</li> <li>Temperature at 100°F or above</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Infrequent, non-disruptive</li> <li>Temperature below 100°F without the use of a medicine that reduces fever (such as Advilor Tylenol) for 24 hours</li> </ul>
Diarrhea or Vomiting	Diarrhea/vomiting occurs 2 or more times in the previous 24 hours of school start time	<ul> <li>Free from diarrhea/vomiting for &gt; 24 hours</li> <li>Able to tolerate regular food</li> <li>Temperature below 100°F without the use of a medicine that reduces fever (such as Advilor Tylenol) for 24 hours</li> </ul>
Pediculosis (Head Lice)	If live lice are present prior to the start of the school day	<ul> <li>Proof of treatment is provided OR</li> <li>Release from doctor or examination by the school nurse confirming lice-free</li> </ul>
Rash or Skin Infection	Rash or signs of skin infection that have not been seen by a doctor     Temperature at 100°F or above	<ul> <li>Rash-free or written release from doctor</li> <li>After 24 hours on antibiotics/antifungals for skin infection</li> <li>Temperature below 100°F without the use of a medicine that reduces fever (such as Advilor Tylenol) for 24 hours</li> </ul>
Ringworm/ Scabies	Can return to school once treatment has started	Ringworm: Cover the area while at school, if possible.

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Sore Throat	<ul> <li>Sore throat with swollen lymph nodes, headache, nausea, and/or fever</li> <li>Positive culture for Strep throat</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Resolution of accompanying symptoms at least 24 hours.</li> <li>Temperature below 100°F without the use of a medicine that reduces fever (such as Advil or Tylenol) for 24 hours</li> <li>24 hours on antibiotics if positive for Strep</li> </ul>
Chickenpox (Varicella)	<ul> <li>Itchy pink/red rash with small fluid-filled blisters</li> <li>Temperature at 100°F or above</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>All lesions are crusted over and dry with no new lesions, usually 5-7 days</li> <li>Temperature below 100°F without the use of a medicine that reduces fever (such as Advil or Tylenol) for 24 hours</li> </ul>
Influenza (Flu), Flu-like Illness or other Respiratory Viral Illnesses including Covid	If a positive Influenza or Covid test, remain at home and contact the school nurse as soon as possible	<ul> <li>Temperature below 100°F         without the use of a medicine         that reduces fever (such as         Advil or Tylenol) for 24 hours</li> <li>Symptoms improving for 24         hours OR clearance from         healthcare provider</li> </ul>
