Principles of Management/Management of Corps: (AS IV) - BLOCK

SCHOOL YEAR: 2018-2019

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1. This course is broken into three parts:

Part A – Aerospace Science-AS 400: Management of Cadet Corps (40%)

The purpose of this course is to enable students to develop their skills as leaders and managers applying what they have previously learned to their corps responsibilities.

Part B – Leadership Education-LE 400: Principles of Management (40%)

Students develop fundamental management and leadership skills which are then applied to corps activities. Wings, Cadet Fitness programs, Drill and ceremony, community service, and mentoring programs are completed in a professional manner.

Part C—Cadet Fitness and Physical Training (CFT): Leading and participation. (20%)

Students teach weekly health and fitness subject and then lead CFT exercises and sports activities.

- 2. **COURSE GOALS/PERFORMANCE STANDARDS** *The student will*:
 - 1. Know the history and the importance of management. Apply the theories learned.
 - 2. Demonstrate understanding of the fundamental concepts of management.
 - 3. Demonstrate knowledge of effective techniques for management functions.
 - 4. Know the techniques and skills involved in planning and decision making.
 - 5. Demonstrate knowledge of effective techniques for management decisions.
 - 6. Know the importance of managing change, stress, and innovation.
 - 7. Manage selected corps activities and practice planning, organizing, coordinating, directing, controlling, and decision making.
 - 8. Know the key elements of individual and group behavior, the importance of the communication process, and the characteristics of a good leader.
 - 9. Use effective communication skills.
 - 10. Meet military uniform standards, grooming and standards of conduct and lead others.
 - 11. Carry out drill and ceremony functions with ease and professionalism.
 - 12. Meet or exceed all requirements of section VI Cadet Operations inspection checklist!!!

3. CLASS FORMAT:

A variety of teaching methodologies will be used throughout the year. All will require very active student participation and leadership. Staff will lead, manage and motivate the entire corps to ensure success for every cadet. Students will work both individually and in-groups. Many assignments will require creative thinking. Activities will include examination of primary source documents, analysis of Air Force studies and the real life activity of the operation of the Cadet Group.

NOTE: AS 400 cadets will teach Uniform wear, Flight Drill, Customs and Courtesies, Health and Physical Fitness throughout the semester.

5. **INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS**: Materials will include the following:

6. COURSE REQUIREMENTS: Students will be required to:

- A. Be a LEADER and set the example.
- B. Complete textbook readings and any homework assignments.
- C. Be an active participant in class discussions and cadet corps activities.
- D. Work with and MENTOR an assigned cadet flight.
- E. Properly wear an Air Force uniform one day per week on the day designated.
- F. Perform drill requirements properly to include marching a flight as a leader.
- G. Practice Air Force customs, courtesies, discipline and respect at all times.
- H. Participate in two community service events per semester.

7. **STUDENT EVALUATION**: Due to the nature of the AFJROTC program, non-academic activities (uniform wear, military bearing/self-discipline, drill, etc) are all graded events. Point values are assigned to each area. Cumulative points earned divided by total points available result in the student's final grade. Bonus points (extra credit) can be earned for designated activities to encourage initiative and participation. Bonus points earned are reflected in individual student cumulative point totals, but are not part of the total points available figure. Points are deducted for poor leadership.
