

Title I Information for Parents

Title I Overview

Title I is the name for a federally funded education program. Title I provides additional money to qualifying schools. The amounts of funds are determined by the percentage of students participating in the free and reduced school nutrition program.

Title I resources support additional staff, professional development, materials, supplies, technology, software and services which promote better learning opportunities for students served in Title I schools.

In a School-wide Program, all students are considered Title I students. All students can be served, and all teachers are Title I teachers. The purpose of the school-wide program is to improve academic achievement throughout the Title I Schools so that all students demonstrate proficiency related to the State's academic content and achievement standards, particularly those students furthest away from proficiency.

Accountability: Title I requires documentation to ensure that students are being served appropriately and that funding is being used wisely. Documentation comes in the form of grade or subject level meetings. Assessment results are filed for each student.
