



SOCIAL & BEHAVIORAL SERVICES

Safe and supportive schools are critical to the well-being of the whole community. The Social and Behavioral Services Department supports a wide range of student support and services, such as truancy interventions, parental and community involvement, homeless needs, grievance claims, and code of conduct / DHA (Disciplinary Hearing Authority) inquiries. Crisis counselors, social workers, and school counselors, as well as Coordinated School Health, including school nurses are available. The goal of the Social and Behavioral Services Department is to provide non-academic support for students to be successful academically, socially, and emotionally.

- Provides school choice options for students through Open Enrollment. Parents can apply to attend schools other than their zoned school based on their interests and programs of study
- Distributes uniform clothing, school supplies, winter coats, and snack backpack food to students
- Offers social and emotional resources, as well as counseling services, to students and parents
- Provides opportunities for parents to partner with schools through Parent Academy classes
- Ensures rights and services are given to children and youth experiencing homelessness
- Arranges activities and events for parents, as well as mental health resources and support
- Conducts truancy hearings and works with students, parents, and schools to provide necessities such as transportation, clothes, etc. to help keep students in school
- Provides academic support and instruction for students who are not physically able to attend school

EARLY LEARNING PROGRAM

Pre-K is a voluntary classroom-based preschool program that provides students with foundational learning skills. Pre-K is highly encouraged and helps students develop social skills while easing the transition from home to elementary school. Currently, there are 45 Pre-K classrooms in our district serving over 700 students. JMCSS offers many Pre-K options for families. The Pre-K curriculum is research-based with goals that are connected to all four learning domains: science experiences, engaging math, authentic literacy, and social development.

- Pre-K offered at 11 schools in the district:
 Alexander Elementary, Andrew Jackson
 Elementary, Arlington Elementary, Community
 Montessori, Denmark Elementary, East
 Elementary, Isaac Lane Elementary, Lincoln
 Elementary, Nova Early Learning, Rose Hill
 School, and South Elementary
- Multiple Learning Options:
 - Unique multi-age early childhood classrooms with Pre-K and K students at Community Montessori School, one of the few like it in west Tennessee
 - Two Head Start collaborative classrooms at Isaac Lane Elementary and Nova Early Learning Center where the student:teacher ratio is even lower
- Nova Early Learning Center serves 3 and 4-yearold Pre-K students
 - Special education services available at Nova Early Learning Center for children as young as 3-years old
 - Services on site: speech and language therapy, nurse, and occupational and physical therapy
 - Multi-sensory room available for students





CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Career and Technical Education combines industry-based theory and procedures with real-world opportunities. This maximizes authentic learning opportunities for our students. The CTE Department offers dual-enrollment opportunities and ensures high-quality faculty, resources, equipment, and industry credentials.

- 32 programs of study in JMCSS high schools prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs in marketing, finance, hospitality and management
- Programs of study in 16 out of 16 National Career Clusters
- Offers dual college credit statewide
- Prepares future health professionals with education and leadership skills
- Work-based learning opportunities
- Technological literacy (STEM) science, technology, engineering, and mathematics

INNOVATION

The JMCSS Innovation Department reimagines modes of learning and partnerships in education to ensure our schools meet the needs of the 21st century. There are Innovation Impact Institutes at each high school and either established or in the implementation phase at each middle school. The Innovation Department oversees STEM, Computer Science, and College, Career, and Technical Education initiatives. By identifying innovative practices in education and industry, JMCSS provides transformative postsecondary preparation and workforce development strategies.

STEM & Computer Science

- Robotics This program provides opportunities for students to learn how to code and write commands for robots. Students step into the world of science, acquiring knowledge and skills that will be useful and applicable beyond the classroom
- eSports A rapidly growing trend in many schools and colleges, eSports is organized, competitive video gaming between students which fosters teamwork, communication, strategic thinking, hand-eye coordination, and problem-solving skills
- GreenpowerUSA Inspires innovation in young people through the immersive experience of designing, building, and racing electric-powered vehicles

FINE ARTS

Jackson-Madison County Schools values the fine arts and stresses the importance of educating the whole child. There are opportunities for students to take advantage of the arts at every age and to participate in district events.

 All high schools offer a variety of fine arts and performing arts such as concert band, jazz band, pep band, marching band, advanced choir, girls' choir, art, theater, dance, piano, and general music.

ACADEMICS

In partnership with parents and the community, Jackson-Madison County Schools strives for educational excellence that inspires students to cultivate their individual potential and positively impact their world. The district provides students robust innovative activities and additional support to achieve their maximum potential.

- Families can enroll students in Pre-K at age 4 at eleven school sites, tuition free.
- All middle school students explore career and extracurricular options. Middle schools offer clubs, STEM, and early postsecondary exposure.
- High school students are afforded an array of choices to prepare them for postsecondary options or the workforce.
 - College: associate degree, dual enrollment with local colleges, Advanced Placement courses

- Workforce: Local Options and Opportunities Program (LOOP), CTE courses (nursing, Junior ROTC, welding, cosmetology, automotive, etc.)
- Robotics can be found at the elementary, middle, and high school levels.
- STEM is available at all elementary and middle schools.
- After-school and in-school tutoring options are available.
- Comprehensive English as a Second Language (ESL) Program assists students in need.
- K-8 Summer Learning Camps have over 2,000 students.
- Freshman Academy three-day orientation for incoming freshmen prepares upcoming students.





FACILITIES

The Jackson-Madison County School System is an award-winning school district, serving approximately 13,000 students in 26 schools. The district maintains over 30 facilities. Several are unique, such as the 5,000 seat Oman Arena and Nova Early Learning Center. The new Pope School, a PreK-8 community school, will be in the North Jackson area. This school is projected to open at the start of the 2025-2026 school year.

UNIQUE SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Beyond the traditional school programming, Jackson-Madison County Schools offers a variety of unique program options for families. Open enrollment is available at every school, space permitting.

College Preparatory School: Madison Academic High School

Madison Academic High School is ranked in the top ten performing high schools in the state of Tennessee. This standout school has received the highest school designation for the state of Tennessee as a Level 5 School for over 15 consecutive years.

• Early College Program: Jackson Central-Merry Early College High

Students can fast track their college plans or begin building a career by simultaneously earning a high school diploma and college associate degree in just four years - and at no cost to families – through a partnership with Jackson State Community College.

Academic Academy: Northeast Middle School Academic Academy

Housed within Northeast Middle School, the Academic Academy is an academic magnet program for middle school students. The vision is to encourage and challenge students to excel while earning high school credits in Algebra I, foreign language, and Environmental Science.

CyberSchool: Jackson Academic STEAM Academy (JASA)

Families enjoy the flexible learning schedule and homeschool feel of Jackson Academic STEAM Academy while reaping the benefits of a traditional school. Students can participate in all district extracurricular activities such as sports and band with their home school while taking advantage of innovative practices and offerings such as eSports, drone soccer, and club/STEAM days at JASA.

- Public Montessori: Community Montessori
 Community Montessori is one of only two public
 Montessori schools in the state of Tennessee.
 Multi-age classrooms can be found throughout
 this Pre-K through 8th school, where older
 students can model complex problem-solving
 and critical thinking skills to younger students.
- Early Learning: Nova Early Learning Center
 An early learning environment for 3–4-year-old
 students, Nova Early Learning Center houses
 18 Pre-K classrooms. Special education services
 are available for children beginning at age three;
 speech and language therapy, occupational
 therapy, and physical therapy are available
 on site.
