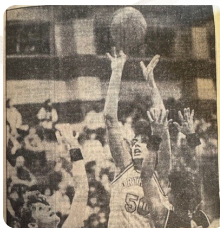
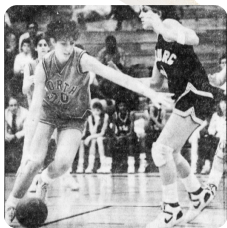

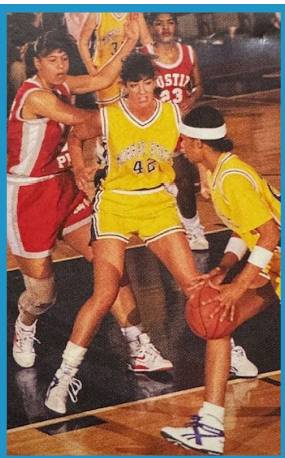
ANGIE WALDON BYERS

ANGIE WALDON BYERS IS A PROUD 1988 GRADUATE OF NORTH SIDE HIGH SCHOOL, WHERE SHE MADE A LASTING IMPACT ON THE LADY INDIANS BASKETBALL PROGRAM. HER JOURNEY BEGAN AT BEECH BLUFF JR. HIGH, WHERE HER TALENT QUICKLY SET HER APART. THROUGHOUT HIGH SCHOOL, SHE EXCELLED ON THE COURT, EARNING NUMEROUS ACCOLADES, INCLUDING BEING A FOUR-YEAR LETTERMAN, THREE-TIME ALL-DISTRICT HONOREE, AND A STANDOUT IN MULTIPLE TOURNAMENTS—EARNING ALL-DISTRICT TOURNAMENT, ALL-REGIONAL (TWICE), ALL-REGIONAL TOURNAMENT, AND ALL-STATE TOURNAMENT HONORS. SHE WAS ALSO RECOGNIZED AS A FINALIST FOR THE BEST OF THE WEST BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD AND SHINED ON THE INTERNATIONAL STAGE AT THE GRAND BAHAMAS AAU TOURNAMENT.

BYERS PLAYED A PIVOTAL ROLE IN LEADING NORTH SIDE TO BACK-TO-BACK TENNESSEE SUB-STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS IN 1987 AND 1988, CONTRIBUTING TO AN IMPRESSIVE 64-8 RECORD OVER HER FINAL TWO SEASONS UNDER THE LEADERSHIP OF MADISON COUNTY SPORTS HALL OF FAME COACH JOE HOLLOWAY. IN 1987, THE LADY INDIANS—RANKED SIXTH IN THE STATE—NARROWLY FELL TO SHELBYVILLE, THE NATION'S NO. 1-RANKED TEAM, IN A HARD-FOUGHT 28-27 GAME. THE FOLLOWING SEASON, NORTH SIDE EARNED NATIONAL RECOGNITION, RANKING NO. 25 IN USA TODAY. AS TEAM CAPTAIN HER SENIOR YEAR, BYERS LEFT A LEGACY OF LEADERSHIP AND SKILL, FINISHING HER HIGH SCHOOL CAREER WITH AN IMPRESSIVE 51% FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE.

FOLLOWING HIGH SCHOOL, BYERS CONTINUED HER BASKETBALL CAREER AT MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY ON A FULL ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIP. SHE MADE AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT, EARNING A SPOT ON THE OHIO VALLEY CONFERENCE (OVC) ALL-FRESHMAN TEAM IN 1988-89 AND HELPING HER TEAM REACH THE WOMEN'S NATIONAL INVITATION TOURNAMENT (WNIT). SHE RECEIVED OVC ROOKIE OF THE YEAR HONORABLE MENTION AND WAS NAMED THE TEAM'S DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN 1990-91 FOR HER RELENTLESS DEFENSIVE PLAY. AS A SENIOR CAPTAIN, SHE SET THE LADY RACERS' CAREER BLOCK SHOT RECORD (74) AND FINISHED WITH A 70% FREE THROW PERCENTAGE, AVERAGING 13 POINTS AND SEVEN REBOUNDS PER GAME. SHE GRADUATED WITH A B.S. IN BUSINESS/MARKETING.

TODAY, ANGIE WALDON BYERS CONTINUES TO SERVE THE RESIDENTS OF MADISON COUNTY AS AN ELECTED OFFICIAL. SHE WAS APPOINTED MADISON COUNTY REGISTER OF DEEDS IN 2016 AND WAS ELECTED TO THE POSITION IN 2018. NOW IN HER SECOND TERM, SHE REMAINS DEDICATED TO PUBLIC SERVICE AND IS SET FOR REELECTION IN 2026. SHE IS HONORED TO SHARE THIS MOMENT WITH HER FAMILY.



Angie Waldon
North Side, 6-2, Senior, center
Waldon averaged 12.9 points and 6.6 rebounds per game for the 30-4 Maidens, ranked No. 8 in the Associated Press' final poll. She shot 58 percent from the field and 62 percent from the free throw line. Named to the All-District 13-AAA regular-season team, she also was voted to the All-District 13-AAA, All-Region 7-AAA and All-Class AAA State Tournament teams. She signed with Murray, Ky., State during the NCAA's early signing period last November.

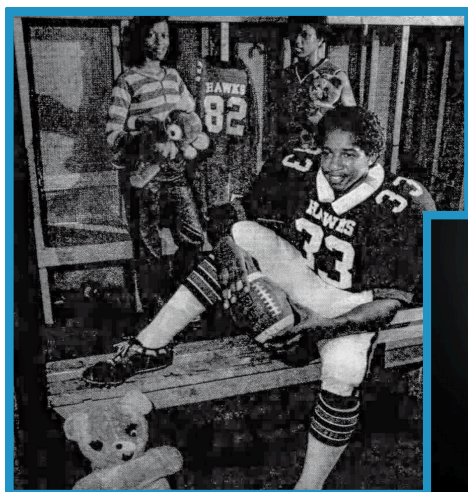


TED AUSTIN

TED R. AUSTIN—WIDELY KNOWN IN THE SPORTS WORLD AS TEDDY AUSTIN—IS A PROUD 1981 GRADUATE OF SOUTH SIDE HIGH SCHOOL. TODAY, HE SERVES AS THE SR. VICE PRESIDENT AND CHIEF CUSTOMER OFFICER FOR JACKSON ENERGY AUTHORITY, ONE OF THE NATIONS FEW MULTI-SERVICE UTILITIES PROVIDING ELECTRICITY, NATURAL GAS, WATER, WASTEWATER TREATMENT, AND FIBER TELECOM SERVICES. HIS LEADERSHIP JOURNEY IN THE ENERGY SECTOR BEGAN IN 2013 WHEN HE WAS NAMED VICE PRESIDENT OF CUSTOMER SERVICE AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS, OVERSEEING FIELD SERVICES, PROPANE SERVICES, CUSTOMER CARE, MARKETING, AND COMMUNICATIONS. HIS ABILITY TO CONNECT WITH PEOPLE, COUPLED WITH HIS STRATEGIC VISION, HAS MADE HIM A KEY FIGURE IN JACKSON'S BUSINESS AND CIVIC LANDSCAPE.

BEFORE HIS PROFESSIONAL CAREER, TEDDY WAS ONE OF THE MOST ELECTRIFYING HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL PLAYERS IN WEST TENNESSEE. AS A SOPHOMORE AT SOUTH SIDE, HE RUSHED FOR OVER 1,500 YARDS, LEADING THE HAWKS TO A HISTORIC 10-WIN SEASON—THE MOST IN SCHOOL HISTORY AT THE TIME—AND A SECOND-ROUND APPEARANCE IN THE STATE PLAYOFFS. HIS STANDOUT PERFORMANCES EARNED HIM ALL-VOLUNTEER CONFERENCE AND ALL-WEST TENNESSEE HONORS. HIS JUNIOR YEAR WAS JUST AS IMPRESSIVE, WITH OVER 1,000 RUSHING YARDS, NINE TOUCHDOWNS, AND SELECTION TO THE ALL-WEST TENNESSEE FIRST TEAM, AS WELL AS STATEWIDE HONORABLE MENTION. IN 1980, THE JACKSON SUN NAMED HIM THE TOP COLLEGE FOOTBALL PROSPECT IN ALL OF WEST TENNESSEE. A TRUE LEADER ON AND OFF THE FIELD, TEDDY WAS NOT ONLY TEAM CAPTAIN BUT ALSO STUDENT COUNCIL PRESIDENT—A TESTAMENT TO HIS CHARACTER AND INFLUENCE.

DESPITE AN INJURY-SHORTENED SENIOR SEASON, TEDDY FINISHED HIS HIGH SCHOOL CAREER AS ONE OF THE TOP RUNNING BACKS IN THE STATE, SURPASSING 3,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS. HIS ATHLETIC PROWESS EARNED HIM AN OPPORTUNITY TO PLAY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE AT MARTIN, WHERE HE CONTINUED HIS FOOTBALL CAREER AND EARNED A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE. THOUGH INJURIES LIMITED HIS TIME ON THE FIELD, HE REMAINED COMMITTED TO HIS EDUCATION AND FUTURE SUCCESS. HIS DEDICATION TO PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL GROWTH LED HIM TO EARN HIS MBA FROM UNION UNIVERSITY IN 2012, FURTHER SOLIDIFYING HIS EXPERTISE IN BUSINESS LEADERSHIP. TED CURRENTLY SERVES AS BOARD VICE CHAIR FOR CAMPAIGN, FOR THE UNITED WAY OF WEST TENN EXECUTIVE BOARD. HE IS THE VICE CHAIR OF THE TENNESSEE VALLEY PUBLIC POWER ASSOCIATION CS CONFERENCE PLANNING COMMITTEE. BEYOND HIS CORPORATE ACHIEVEMENTS, TEDDY REMAINS DEEPLY CONNECTED TO THE JACKSON COMMUNITY, SERVING AS A MENTOR AND LEADER. HIS LEGACY AS AN ATHLETE, STUDENT LEADER, AND BUSINESS EXECUTIVE REFLECTS HIS UNWAVERING COMMITMENT TO EXCELLENCE IN EVERY ARENA.
