Improving Attendance at Rose Hill

Happy New Year Raider Nation! I hope everyone enjoyed their break. Now that school is back in session, I wanted to take time to talk to our families about the importance of school attendance. Attendance is a key factor in student growth and achievement. Each day your child misses school or each day your child is checked in late or checked out early is a day or portion of time of direct and explicit instruction he or she cannot get back.

Our district has a Truancy Policy that we at Rose Hill will uphold. If you have already received letters from the school either via email or by mail or a phone call from one of our school counselors, please be sure your child is at school, all day, every day so that further action does not have to be taken. Beginning today, for any student who has missed 10 or more days, we will actively seek to develop a Progressive Truancy Intervention Plan with each family which will include a referral to the Department of Childrens Services, the District's Truancy Board, and ultimately the Juvenile Court if the truancy is not corrected.

We are on track to accelerating our academic growth and achievement, and we need the partnership of our families to commit to making sure your scholar is at school all day, every day. We will continue to give incentives to our scholars who come to school every day. We appreciate your partnership in this most important matter. Thanks for helping us be Rose Hill Ready each and every day!

- If there is a change in transportation, please notify the office early.



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
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AWARD RECIPIENT

Congratulations to the winners of our first bookmark contest. Their bookmarks will entered in the Tennessee Association of School Libraries Bookmark Contest.





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
THE ENGINEERING DESIGN PROCESS & Design Thinking

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


PreK shared the excitement from their pumpkin PBL units during our STEM night on 11/28/23. Students rolled pumpkins and launched them from a homemade catapult!



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


Kindergarten visited the Ward Tree Farm, then investigated evergreen trees and how trees rely on their root structure!



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First graders enjoyed a visit from JMC Health Department to learn about how we can keep from getting sick. Scholars created posters and "germs" to share!



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


2nd graders designed scenes to act out for the myths they have been reading in Listening and Learning.



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


3rd graders designed animal habitats based on their research in CKLA Reading. Many thanks to Gecko Gals for your positive feedback on scholars' dioramas!
